**1937 Is Banner Year Mount Olive College; Looking Forward To 1938**

The establishment of five student loan funds, tax scholarships, an increase in the student body of forty percent, the addition of four new faculty members and approval by the North Carolina College Conference were some of the marks of progress made by Mount Olive Junior College during 1937, President W. Burkette Raper disclosed today.  
 The growth of the local College has been such that the Executive Committee of the North Carolina State Convention of Free Will Baptist Churches sponsors of the College, has called a special session of the Convention to meet in Mount Olive on January 31 to consider plans for the expansion of the College as a recently acquired sixty acre campus.  
 During 1937, Mount Olive Junior

College added 3,500 volumes to its library, equipped its laboratory for first-year courses in chemistry, completed furnishing all classrooms with new furniture and for the first time a professor giving full-time service to each of the following departments: mathematics, science, Bible, music, and foreign languages.  
 The year 1937 also saw the first graduate of Mount Olive Junior College receive her degree from a senior college where she earned 96 quarter hours and 277 college points.  
 "But with all the progress of last year, we approach 1938 with the confidence that it will surpass 1937 in accomplishments," President Raper declared.

Officers were made to enlarge the membership. The meeting was closed by repeating together the club collect.  
 During the social hour, for recreation each member told to the group one of her New Year Resolutions. The hostess served delicious refreshments consisting of hot coffee, home made fudge and potato chips.

**Changes In Your Social Security**

Farmers are reminded that the 1937 annual social wage reports for agricultural workers are due in January, according to Brevet F. Fitzpatrick, district manager of the Wilmington social security office.  
 All farm workers are covered who: 1) were paid \$150 or more in cash in 1937 by one farm employer, or 2) worked for any agricultural employer on 20 or more days during the year where the cash wages were figured on a time basis-hourly, daily, weekly, etc. It is the employer's responsibility to report the wages and remit the social security tax on such wages to the Internal Revenue Service.  
 Any farmer who has one or more such covered employees should apply for an employer's identification number from District Director of Internal Revenue, located at Greensboro, N. C. The Internal Revenue Service will then supply the necessary forms on which the reports are to be made. The reports call for the employee's name, social security account number, and the total cash wages paid him during the year up to \$4,500 in a year for each employee; 2-1-2 per cent of the tax is withheld from the employee's pay and the other 2-1-2 per cent is the employer's matching amount.  
 More detailed information may be obtained from your social security representative or your Director of Internal Revenue.
