"This larger faculty will result in some additions to the curriculum," commented President R. T. L. Liston, "but its chief effect will be to strengthen the institutional program by decreasing the teaching load of the faculty."

The new Dean of Students at King will be the Reverend George A. Anderson, formerly vice-president of Montreat College.

E. C. C. ORCHESTRA

Donald H. Hayes will act as conductor of the East Carolina College Orchestra during the present school year. A faculty member of the department of music at the college, Mr. Hayes has been concert master of the orchestra for the past five years.

He has just been appointed to direct the ensemble by Dr. Earl Beach, head of the department of music. Arrangements for the year's work are now in the making. The 1958-59 program will include study, rehearsal, and public appearances on the campus and elsewhere, according to present plans.

The East Carolina College Orchestra is composed of students, faculty members, and instrumentalists from Greenville and other localities in the eastern part of the state. A sixty-member organization, it has been directed for the past seven years by Dr. Kenneth N. Cuthbert, who resigned last summer as head of the East Carolina department of music.

Mr. Hayes began rehearsal with the group Thursday night. During the fall quarter, the orchestra will rehearse on Monday night of each week at 7:30 in the band and orchestra room of Music Hall. The first concert of the year is scheduled for December 9. String players are in demand and are invited to join the ensemble.

A graduate of New York University, Mr. Hayes has played with the New York City Symphony under Walter Damrosch; the Westchester, N. Y. County Symphony under Albert Stoessel; and the New York Summer Orchestra under Serge Koussevitzky. He has studied conducting under such teachers as Stoessel, Victor Rebman, C. Warren Erb, and Thomas F. D'Arcy.

During the World War II period he studied conducting at the OCS Army Band School in Germany and Czechoslovakia he conducted symphonies made up of various U. C. Army groups.
