**Civil Service Exams**  
 A new examination has been announced for shorthand reporter the Civil Service Commission said today. Applications will also be accepted in this examination from reporters who use closed microphones. The obs to be filled pay from \$4,490 to \$5,985 a year and are located in various agencies in the Washington, D. C. area.

All applicants will be required to take a general abilities test and a 5-minute dictation exercise. For positions paying \$4,490, the rate of dictation will be 100 words per minute; no experience is required. For positions paying from \$4,900 to \$5,985 a year, the dictation rate will be 175 words per minute and applicants are required to have had from 1 to 3 years of pertinent experience depending on the grade level for which application is made.

Applications will be accepted until further notice and must be filed with the U. S. Civil Service Commission, Washington 25, D. C. Further information is given in civil service announcement No. 177 which may be obtained from most post offices throughout the country or from the Commission's Washington office.
