LEASED WIRE TO BE INSTALLED AT CHOWAN - AP SERVICE

Beginning next September, a leased wire will bring into the School of Graphic Arts at Chowan College, the State news service of the Associated Press, according to John McSweeney, director of the school.

Two printers will be installed to receive AP news as it is transmitted from various points to a central office of this world-wide news gathering agency. Then, by way of Western Union wires, the
