Care Of Tobacco Plants In Beds Essential; Prevention And Treatment Means Given

Farmers are being urged to do everything possible to preserve what tobacco plants they have in order that transplanting can be accomplished as early as possible.

There is also a danger of anthracnose attacking the tobacco plants but the same treatment as used for blue mold with control anthracnose. Although this disease is not widespread in tobacco plant beds, it is becoming more common each year.

Chemicals which are recommended for the control of blue mold and anthracnose are: ferimate, nu leaf, ferradon, two pounds of the material per 50 gallons of water or in dust treatments with 15 per cent of the chemical; dithane Z-78 and parzate, one and one-half pounds per 50 gallons of water of 10 per cent concentration of material in dust; and in dithane M-22 and manzate, one-quarter pound to 50 gallons of water of two percent of the chemical dust treatment.

It should be pointed out that blue mold growth is favored by cool nights (50 to 60 degrees, which is warming trend as noted above) especially if accompanied by rain, fog or heavy dews. Either lower or high night temperatures (below 45 degrees and above 70 degrees F.) slow down the attack.

County Records Manual Distributed To County Officials On Monday

This week the State Department of Archives and History has distributed to all county officials in North Carolina a 73 page County Records Manual. This Manual is designed to serve as a guide for County Officials in matters pertaining to the retention and disposal of public records in their custody.

The State Advisory Committee on County Records was created for the two-fold purpose of assisting in the preparation of the County Records Manual and of furnishing advice as to the records which should be microfilmed for security purposes. This committee worked hard during the 1959 State Legislature to help secure the enactment of legislation which authorized and directed the State Department of Archives and History to formulate and execute a program of inventorying, repairing, and microfilming for security purposes those official records of the several counties which the Department determines have permanent value and of providing safe storage for microfilm copies of such records. This work will be done at state expense, without cost to the counties.
