Grand Jury Returns True Bill On Oates

The Duplin County Grand Jury has returned a true bill of indictment against Jesse James Oates for the murder of James B. Tadlock, of route 5, Clinton on the night of December 15, 1959.

Oates, a Negro man from Faison was arrested last week in the Sampson County jail and brought to Duplin County to stand trial for Tadlock's death.

The true bill against Oates charges both robbery and murder. Oates will be tried in the August term of Duplin Criminal Superior Court.

He is being held in Duplin County jail without privilege of bond, according to Sheriff Miller.
