Beulaville VO-AG Student Has Corn Variety Demonstration Plot
 A corn variety testing demonstration is being conducted this summer by Hollis Thigpen, FFA member at Beulaville School. He is the son of Mr. and Mrs. William Tuggen who live on the northern extreme of the Beulaville School District.
 In a variety test each hybrid receives the same amount of moisture, fertilizer, cultivation, and is grown in the same soil type. By being grown under like conditions, any variation in yield, described or undescribed characteristics, showing up could be attributed to the specific genetic background of the hybrid. Six of the more popular corn hybrids are shown in Hollis plot.
 A cordial invitation is extended to all interested parties to visit this project, and possibly benefit from his efforts.
 In the picture Hollis is shown with his VO-AG advisor discussing the merits of the test. The VO-AG Dept. at Beulaville commends this student for a job well done in carrying out recommended practices. Adult farmers would do well to observe and adhere to cultivation and fertilization practices used in this variety test by Hollis.
