TIME EXTENDED FOR UNITED TOBACCO COMMENTS

The U. S. Department of Agriculture has announced that the time for submitting views and comments on a proposed change in price support regulations on unried flue-cured tobacco has been extended from April 23 to May 15.

USDA announced on March 27 that consideration is being given to changes which would make price supports available on unried tobacco on a limited and experimental basis during the first five sale days on all South Carolina markets and the Border Belt markets in North Caro-

Price support grade loan rates for tobacco offered in unried form would be less than the rates for the same grades offered in tied form. During 1961 season, the differential between grades of flue-cured tobacco marketed unried in Florida-Georgia and those marketed tied elsewhere was 6.00 per hundredweight.

USDA invites the views and comments of tobacco producers, warehousemen, manufacturers, dealers and other interested persons relative to the proposed change. In order to afford all interested persons additional time to submit views and comments, the final date for submissions has been extended to May 15.

Views and comments should be submitted in writing and should be received by Murray Thompson, Director, Price Division, Agricultural Stabilization and Conservation Service, U. S. Department of Agriculture, Washington 25, D. C., no later than May 15, 1962.

Notice Employers

Employers liable for income tax withheld and social security taxes in excess of \$100 for the month of April must deposit such taxes with a depository, Mr. J. E. Wall of the Internal Revenue office in Greensboro, N. C. reported today. Stressing the importance of compliance with deposit deadline of May 15, 1962, Mr. J. E. Wall added that a Form 450 should be used for this purpose.

Deposits may be made in local authorized banks or Federal Reserve Banks, said J. E. Wall.

Employers who do not have a copy of Circular E, "Employer's Tax Guide," may obtain it from any local IRS office. This publication contains a full discussion of employment taxes together with tables and percentage methods for computing such taxes.
