Child Fatally Injured

Duplin suffered another highway fatality on Sunday, June 10. Little Michael Wayne Scurry, 23 months old child of Route 2, Wallace, darted out in front of a car, and died as a result of injuries, it is reported.

The driver stated that he did not see the child until he was on the highway, he pulled the car to the left to miss the child and the right front fender hit the child. The child was admitted to Duplin General Hospital with a broken leg and fractured skull and died about 9:40 p. m.
