

There are more than 700,000 rural boys in Scouting. Tobacco is grown in 22 of Tennessee's 95 counties. Tobacco cash receipts in Tennessee (burley) are estimated at about \$70 million a year - 14 per cent of the state's cash agricultural income of more than \$500 million. Vastly increased use of fish meal and oil for poultry and cattle feed has helped to develop industrial fishing, and scores of boats go out only for this kind of raw fish material.
