### Keep it Before the People

John Pool and the opposition are in favor of taking the tax off of articles, such as Whiskey, jewelry, Pianos, Billiard Tables, Bowie knives, Pistols, ~~knives~~, matches, Lawyers fees, &c in all Five hundred thousand Dollars, and placing it upon the farmer, only thirty thousand of which is to be an additional tax upon slaves.

### Keep it before the People.

That John Pool favors reducing the land tax \$50,000, adding \$30,000 for slaves, reducing the revenue of \$278,000 received from luxuries to about \$98,000, and making horses, mules, carts, plows, wagons, cows, sheep, and hogs, and the crops of the farmer make up the reduction thus made. He favors reducing the tax of the farmer \$10,000, and adding on his stock and crops \$200,000.
