This Week in History

Aug. 15, 1978
WASHINGTON — The House assassinations committee was told that scientific tests failed to prove whether the bullet that killed Dr. Martin Luther King Jr. came from the window of a boarding house or the bushes below. James Earl Ray pleaded guilty to slaying King on April 4, 1968, while the Civil Rights leader stood on the balcony of a Memphis hotel across from the boarding house. Ray had since recanted his plea and maintained he did not fire the shot that killed King.

Aug. 20, 1987

LEXINGTON — An ammonia leak at Coble Dairy forced the evacuation of a four-block area and approximately 100 people, 19 of whom were taken to a local hospital after complaining of breathing difficulties. No serious injuries were reported.

Aug. 15, 1989

Thomasville police began cracking down on skateboarders, threatening to send them to juvenile court if they were found using boards in the street. The first disciplinary step was bring the child home to parents. If caught again, the child was to be brought to juvenile court.

Aug. 18, 1992

High Rock Lake was the second most dangerous body of water in the state in 1991, according to a report released by the North Carolina Wildlife Services Commission. Davidson County's largest lake was the site of 10 boat-related accidents in 1991, although no fatalities were reported. Lake Normon, near Charlotte, reported the largest number of accidents,


