The Davidson County Health Department will be offering a flu clinic on Thursday, Nov. 4, from 1 to 4:30 p.m. at the health department in Lexington. The health department will be following the guidelines established by the Centers for Disease Control for giving the flu vaccine, which recommends providing the vaccine to anyone age 6 months and older. To schedule an appointment, call (336) 236-3096. Walk-ins are welcome as well.

Please wear clothing that makes it easy to get to the upper arm. Curb service will be available for those people with disabilities.

There will be a \$22 charge for the flu vaccine or we will bill Medicare/Medicaid for the vaccine. We will accept cash, check, and debit or credit cards for payment. In order to bill Medicare/ Medicaid, patients must provide their Medicare/Medicaid card. Medicare recipients must have both Medicare Part A and Part B in order for Medicare to pay. People with Medicare C must go to their primary physician in order for Medicare to pay for the vaccine or they can come to our clinic and pay for the vaccine out-of-pocket.

Oct. 31, 1989

WASHINGTON - The first court test of the nation's new flag-desecration law began with charges filed against three demonstrators arrested in a flag burning protest on the steps of the U.S. Capital. The Flag Protection Act of 1989, which went into effect Oct. 28 without Pres. George W. Bush's signature, carries penalties of up to a year in jail and a \$1,000 fine.

Oct. 31, 2010


October 2010 had five Fridays, five Saturdays and five Sundays all in one month. This happens one in 823 years.

Nov. 1, 2001

Because many of them couldn't donate blood to help with the disaster relief in the wake of the Sept. 11 terrorist attacks, the students of Thomasville High School's allmåle character education class initiated their own relief fund – Dollars for Disaster – raising a total of \$1,400 from teachers and students at all of the city schools. The money raised went to families who lost a father in the attacks.
