

Flu clinic

The Davidson County Health Department will be offering a flu clinic today from 1 to 4:30 p.m. at the health depart ment in Lexington. The health department will be following the guidelines established by the Centers for Disease Control for giving the flu vaccine, which recommends providing the vaccine to anyone age 6 months and older. To schedule an appointment, call (336) 236-3096. Walk-ins are welcome as well.

Please wear clothing that makes it easy to get to the upper arm. Curb service will be available for those people with disabilities.

There will be a \$22 charge for the flu vaccine or we will bill Medicare/Medicaid for the vaccine. We will accept cash, check, and debit or credit cards for payment. In order to bill Medicare/ Medicaid, patients must provide their Medicare/Medicaid card. Medicare recipients must have both Medicare Part A and Part B in order for Medicare to pay. People with Medicare C must go to their primary physician in order for Medicare to pay for the vaccine or they can come to our clinic and pay for the vaccine out-of-pocket.


