Killed was Frank P. Spaugh, 19, of Rocky Mount, who was struck by a car operated by Samuel Shanklin of Mebane near the same place where three other men have been killed in the past 10 days. The accident occured in front of Jim Crumpler's lumber yard.

Sheriff S. T. Latta. who investigated the accident, said that Spaugh was riding a motorbike on the left side of the road without any lights and that the car operated by Shanklin crashed into him. In a hearing before a coroner's jury Shanklin was released when the jury termed the accident "un-avoidable." On the jury were R. O. Forrest, Herbert Watkins, George Gilmore, Ben Johnston, Charles Walker, Jr., and Chand-ler Cates, all of Hillsboro.

Ocupants of the car driven by Shanklin were James S. Warren Irvin Jefferies and Kennette Smith, all of Mebane. The accident ocured at 9:50.

Discovery of cases of polio in Florida and the desire of the state board of health to prevent a recurrence of the state epidemic of 1944 prompted the enactment of this law.




