

### Pre-School Clinics Being Held In Orange County

T. Proffit and C. W. Davis, superintendents of schools, announced this week that the Health Department is conducting pre-school clinics throughout the various schools in the county for all children who will be six years of age or before October 1, 1950.

At these clinics, each child will be weighed and his teeth, ears, throat, heart, and skeleton examined. In addition, immunizations will be offered. It is hoped that parents bring their children and follow him through the clinic so they can get the information as to what the child needs in order to be physically fit for school next fall.

The state law in regard to immunizations is very specific and the school authorities have no doubt about the enrollment of children who fail to comply, it is pointed out.

Following is a summary of the information taken by the Health Department and school authorities: Smallpox Vaccination— This is required by state law of all children attending school. All children attending school not previously vaccinated will, therefore, be required to be vaccinated either by a family physician or this service will be offered by the Health Department. A written statement of a physician stating that vaccination will be dangerous to the child will be sufficient for no vaccination.

Diphtheria Immunization— State law requires that all children be immunized in the first year of life with a certificate from the physician listing the dates of immunization must be presented at either clinic or at the time of entrance into school (first grade). Recent scientific studies indicate that even those children who have previously had diphtheria toxoid should have their protection strengthened at five or six years of age. For this reason the Health Department no longer recommends tick testing, but urges the giving of a booster dose of toxoid to

each child before entrance to school. Whooping cough—Recent state law requires that all children be immunized in the first year of life and before school attendance. All children must present certificates of immunization or physicians written statement indicating that they have had the disease or take the vaccine either in the private physician's office or the Health Department before school attendance. Children, who have had whooping cough vaccine early should have a booster dose on school entrance.

It is recommended that all children planning to enter school (first grade) in the fall attend the pre-school clinics to be held in the school that they will attend. Further it is recommended that each child have a booster or stimulating dose of vaccine against diphtheria, whooping cough, and smallpox; that is, if he or she has received the immunization before this age as required by law, except smallpox which is required before entry to school. These boosters can be given in the clinic if you do not have your physician give them. Certificates showing the immunizations received must be presented at the time of this clinic or at the time of entrance into school.

The school officials, the P. T. A. representatives, and the Health Department urge all parents to have all defects in children corrected before the time of entry into school. Also they urge that vaccinations and immunizations be done early and not delayed until time to enter into school. It is best to have the corrections and immunizations done before the hot summer months.

Teaching these courses will be Dr. Rosenstengel and Profs. H. A. Perry, A. K. King, W. H. Plemons, Gordon Ellis, Charles F. Milner, and James S. Tippet.

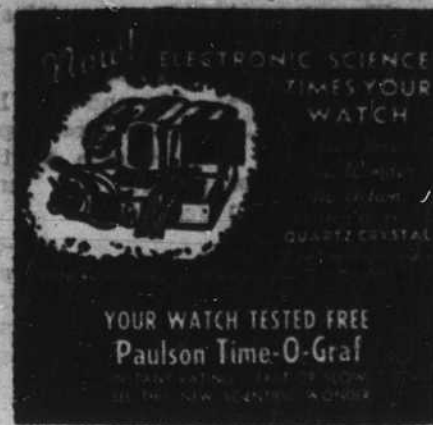
The annual Kite Contest Finals will be given at Central High on the 28th of March.

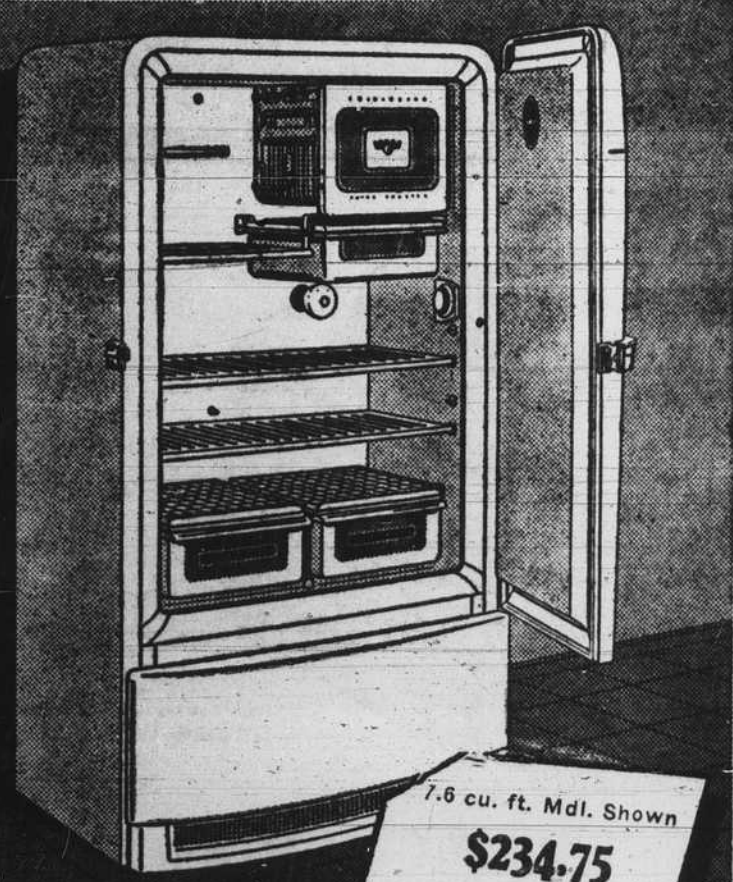
