Incidentally, talk around Raleigh is that the par bill was a dream-child of Wachovia Bank, aimed at fighting the First Citizen's Bank and Trust Company, which has headquarters for its 27 banks at Smithfield. All of First Citizen's 27 banks are non-par, and would have been hit a damaging blow if the bill had been passed.

In case you hadn't heard, the par bank bill got an unfavorable report by the Senate Committee on aBnks and aBnking. The only dissenting vote came from Senator A. B. Stoney of Burke who, along with Senator Marvin Leatherman of Lincoln, introduced the bill.
