Pan-Fried Fish Fillets

1 lb. fresh or frozen fish fillets 1/2 cup Pet Evaporated Milk 1/4 cup fine, dry bread crumbs 1/2 teaspoon salt few grains pepper

Cut fillets into serving pieces, then roll in crumbs. Dip pieces into a mixture of milk, salt and pepper. Roll again in rest of crumbs. Brown slowly in 1/4-inch hot fat in a skillet about 5 minutes on each side. Serve hot. Makes 4 servings.
