been assumed for payment by the county.

"Answering your question directly," wrote Love, "it is my view that if the Chapel Hill Administrative unit shall issue bonds under provisions of HB 1278 (1955 Session Laws), this unit will not be entitled to a per capita allocation from the county for debt service on such bonds."

Thus, it would appear that the confusion locally on the issue came about as result of the misinterpretation of the term "district."

Meanwhile, there has been no indication whether the Chapel Hill administrative unit will proceed at an early date to take advantage of the permissive legislative to call for a special bond vote in the city unit. Such action likely will depend upon how Chapel Hill schools, as well as the county, fare in capital outlay appropriations in the new budget now being prepared by the County Commissioners.

Hash Patties With Cheese Sauce

1 lb. can corned beef hash
1 Tablespoon hot fat
1/2 cup Pet Evaporated Milk
1 cup grated, processed American cheese (1/4 lb.)
1/4 teaspoon dry mustard

Cut hash into four slices. Brown hash slices on both sides in hot fat in skillet. While hash is browning, heat milk in saucepan until steaming hot. Add cheese and stir until cheese starts to melt. Remove from heat and continue stirring until cheese is melted. Stir in mustard. Serve hot over the browned hash patties. Makes 4 servings.
