Adventure in Good Eating

At Christmas we enjoy having friends and family in for a few refreshments and the spirit of friendship and joviality always pervades the air. Help keep this spirit there with a few gaily decorated festive snacks. These ice cream santas will please everyone from the tots to the old folks, and I am including a basic spiced tea recipe which will be good at all your winter parties.

Ice Cream Santas

Draw Santa's face on marshmallows using a toothpick dipped in melted chocolate. Moisten top of marshmallow. On each press a cone shaped gum drop for his hat. Place ball or scoop of strawberry or peppermint-stick ice cream on a plate. Top with Stanfa's head. Add a swirl of sweetened whip cream for a beard. Serve immediately. One pint serves 4-5.

Russian Tea

6 tea bags
2 cups sugar
2 cups water
4 big sticks cinnamon

½ pkg. whole cloves
1 No. 2 can pineapple juice
1 No. 2 can orange juice
Make 6 cups tea using tea bags. Boil 2 cups sugar, 2 cups water, 4 sticks cinnamon and ½ box cloves for 5 minutes. Remove from fire and add juice of 4 lemons. Slice lemon rinds into this syrup and let stand for 10 minutes or so. Remove lemon rind. Strain into fruit juices and six cups of tea and simmer.

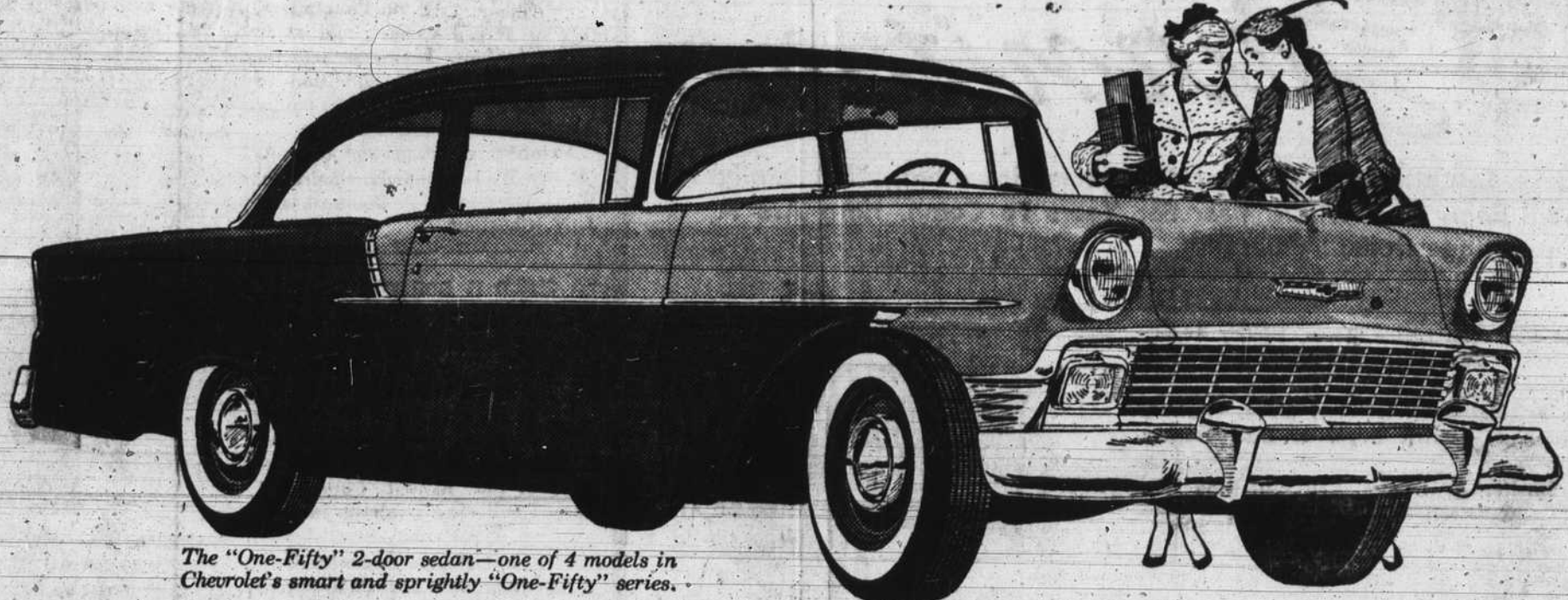
