AVAILABLE in Orange County who plant Aromatic tobacco may place an order for the County Agents office. The seeds are furnished free to growers in each county who plan their crop under supervision of the Extension and the Southeastern Aromatic Tobacco Company. Growers to secure the seed should order early.

**FARM OUTLOOK**

Below is a summary of Farm Outlook prepared by the Agricultural Department of State supply large; domestic slightly; export—up slightly; total demand—up slightly—same as 1955, or slightly—depending on quality of 1956 crop. Grade A milk production slightly; Grade A milk price—down; Manufacturing milk—steady. Eggs—production down, up, broilers—production up, down; turkeys—production down. Prices—no change. Prices—steady to weaker. Prices—higher, with incentive. Slaughter—up 10-12% first of 1956 and about same last year. Hog-corn ratio average. Costs: labor—same; feed—low price until mid-1956; fertilizer—same; materials—same to slightly higher; farm and motor supplies—same; farm machinery—same; interest rates—same. Living Costs: No change except for slight increase of medical and personal services. Prices for food, clothing and appliances probably will remain at present levels.
