The letter from District Director Sanders reads as follows from its pertinent sections:

"Our records indicate that you were granted exemption from Federal income tax under the provisions of Section 101(8) of the Internal Revenue Code (1939). Contributions to organizations exempt under that section are ordinarily not deductible by donors. However, your attention is called to Rev. Rul. 54-243 C. B. 1954-1, 92 which provides as follows:

"Organizations which are exempt under section 101 of the Internal Revenue Code, other than section

1010(6) of the Code, may establish a separate fund exclusively for religious, charitable, scientific, literary, or educational purposes, apart from their other funds. If such separate fund is operated exclusively for such purposes, separate books and accounts are maintained, and it otherwise meets the requirements for exemption under section 101(6) of the Code, contributions to the funds are deductible by donors in computing their taxable net income in the manner and to the extent provided in section 23(o) or 23(q) of the Code. A fund of this character should be organized in such a manner that its assets cannot be

used, upon dissolution or otherwise, for the general purposes of the organization creating it but must be used for purposes similar to those of the fund itself. The status of such a fund should be established in the manner provided

under section 39.101-1 of Regulations 118."

War Orphans Eligible For Education Aid Told To Apply Now

Young men and women planning to attend school this fall under the new War Orphans Education Law were urged today by Veterans Service Officer Walter Wren to file their applications as soon as possible, to avoid unnecessary delays in receiving their first monthly allowance checks.

Application forms are available at his office.

Persons eligible for schooling are those whose veteran-parent died of injuries or diseases resulting from military service during World War I, World War II or the Korean Conflict. Students generally must be between 18 and 23 years old.

Prompt action is needed, VA explained, because normally it will take about three months from the date of application to the date the initial allowance check is placed in the mail. So in the case of young men and women who apply now, the earliest that VA could mail out checks would be mid-November.
