ASC Sign-Up To Pre-Measure Acreage Set

D. V. Roberts, County ASC Office Manager, has announced signup for requesting premeasurement of tobacco and cotton acreage for 1959 will be held at Orange County ASC office from January 2, 1959 to February 15, or until a maximum of 300 applications are filed, which ever is first.

The cost to the farmer for requesting premeasurement is the larger of \$3.00 plus \$1.00 per acre, with a minimum cost of \$8.00 per

Any farmer requesting premeas urement of his allotment of 5 acres or less will be required to pay a minimum fee of \$8 at the County Office at the time he files his request. Anyone requesting premeasurement of allotments of 5.01 acres or more will have to deposit a fee of \$3 plus an additional \$1 for each acre that he is

requesting premeasurement of Roberts says that farmers with tobacco varieties having growth characteristics similar to those designated as Coker 139, Coker 140 Dixie Bright 244, or any mixture or strain of such seed varieties will receive only one-half the sup port rates for comparable grades of other varieties in 1959.
