### Joint Meeting Of Appointing **Bodies Planned**

First steps leading to the establishment of ABC stores in Orange County since the approval of the voters on February 3 is scheduled for tonight at the courthouse.

The Board of County Commissioners and the Orange County Board of Education meet jointly at 8 consider the appointment of a 3-member Alcohol Beverage Control board to establish and administer liquor control stores.

The law provides that the ABC board shall be selected by the County Boards of Commissioners. Education and Health, meeting jointly and with each member having one vote. Inasmuch as this county has no Board of Health per se, it being a part of a health district, and the Chairman of the Commissioners being its representative on the District Board, it has been ruled that the appointments should properly be made by the two former boards.

The county board of alcoholic control will consist of a chairman and two members, the chairman to be appointed for three years and the two members for one and two years respectively.

Only qualifications listed in the law for ABC board members are that they "shall be well known for their character, ability and business acument."


