6 Raids Noted In July Report

Sheriff C. D. Knight reported to
the County Commissioners that dur-
ing the month of July his depart-
ment conducted six raids and made
eight investigations.

There were 53 arrests, 46 civil
papers served and 25 subpoenas
served on witnesses before court.

Fines and costs given by Court
during July to defendant in cases
originating in the Sheriff's Dept.
totalled \$290.40. \$147.39 was collected

by this department for serving civil
papers.
A total of three months was given
defendants in cases originating
in the Sheriff's Dept. that were
placed on probation or given sus-
pended sentences.
