Education week school visits are urged by principals

Principals of two Hillsboro schools have issued special invitations for the public to visit their institutions next week, November 8-14, as part of the local observance of American Education Week.

The special week during which parents and the public are encouraged to visit the schools of their choice, talk with principals and teachers, look over the fa-

cilities and sit in on classes is being sponsored by the Orange County unit of the North Carolina Education Association.

The special invitations were issued by Principal G. A. Brown at Hillsboro High and by Principal Ted B. Shoaf at Cameron Park Elementary School. Lunch may be obtained if notification is made in advance of visitation.

Census job interviews set tomorrow

Mrs. Henry S. Walker, crew leader for this area for the 1959 Census of Agriculture, announces that interviews and tests will be given for census takers tomorrow morning in the Hillsboro Courthouse in the commissioners room beginning at 9 o'clock.

All interested persons are asked to contact Mrs. Walker at her home on Route One, Hillsboro, phone number 2985.

Applicants for census taking jobs must be citizens of the United States, have a high school education or furnish evidence of comparable experience, be in good physical health and of excellent character, and be at least 18 years of age.

They must have sufficient financial resources to sustain themselves for approximately four or five weeks from the date of ap-

pointment until they receive their salary check. Applicants with veteran preference who meet all requirements will be given priority over non-veterans.

Farm census job applicants must be licensed to operate and must provide a privately owned

automobile in good condition. They will be paid on a piece-rate basis for completed agriculture questionnaires and listing of dwellings. Piece-rates are set at levels that will make it possible for a conscientious enumerator to earn approximately \$13 per day.
