Construction hits \$277,098 in Chapel Hill last month

Construction totalling \$277,098 was authorized in 23 building permits issued by Chapel Hill Building Inspector Howard Stewart during December.

Grangers are now considering rural zoning for the county

Orange County grangers are currently considering the advisability of rural zoning regulations.

The matter of rural zoning was recently aired before the County Commissioners by a Research Triangle representative who suggested it would be helpful to development in the three-county area.

County Farm Agent Don Matheson said that Pomona Grange Master Harry Woods of Schley is chairman of a three-member committee also including Parker Roland and Mrs. Quentin Patterson that is studying the zoning idea to see whether rural areas over the County would be better off under zoning.

At the present time only a 20-

square mile area around Chapel Hill has such controls. The Grange committee has come to no conclusions yet. Matheson said, but "is going at the matter pretty thoroughly."
