

New advertising, news persons join staff of News of Orange

ACP open to farmers at this time

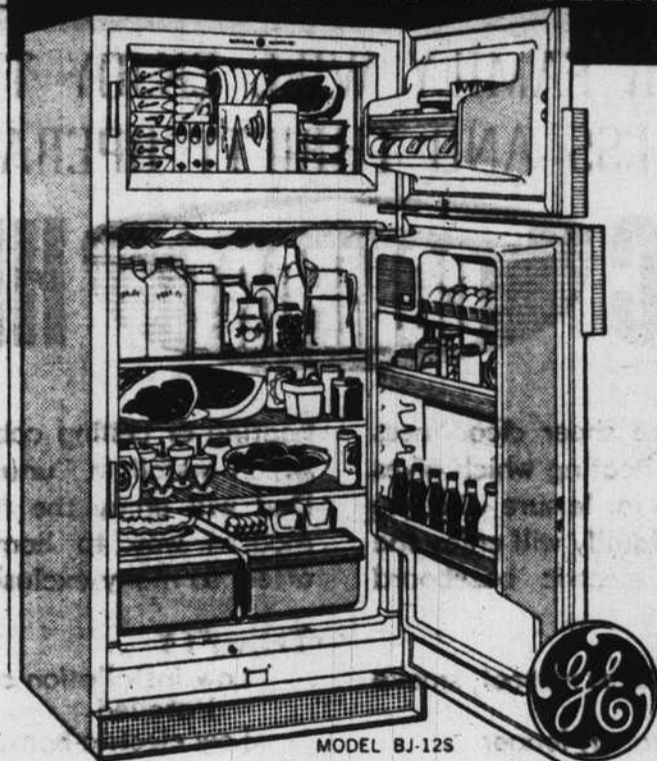
