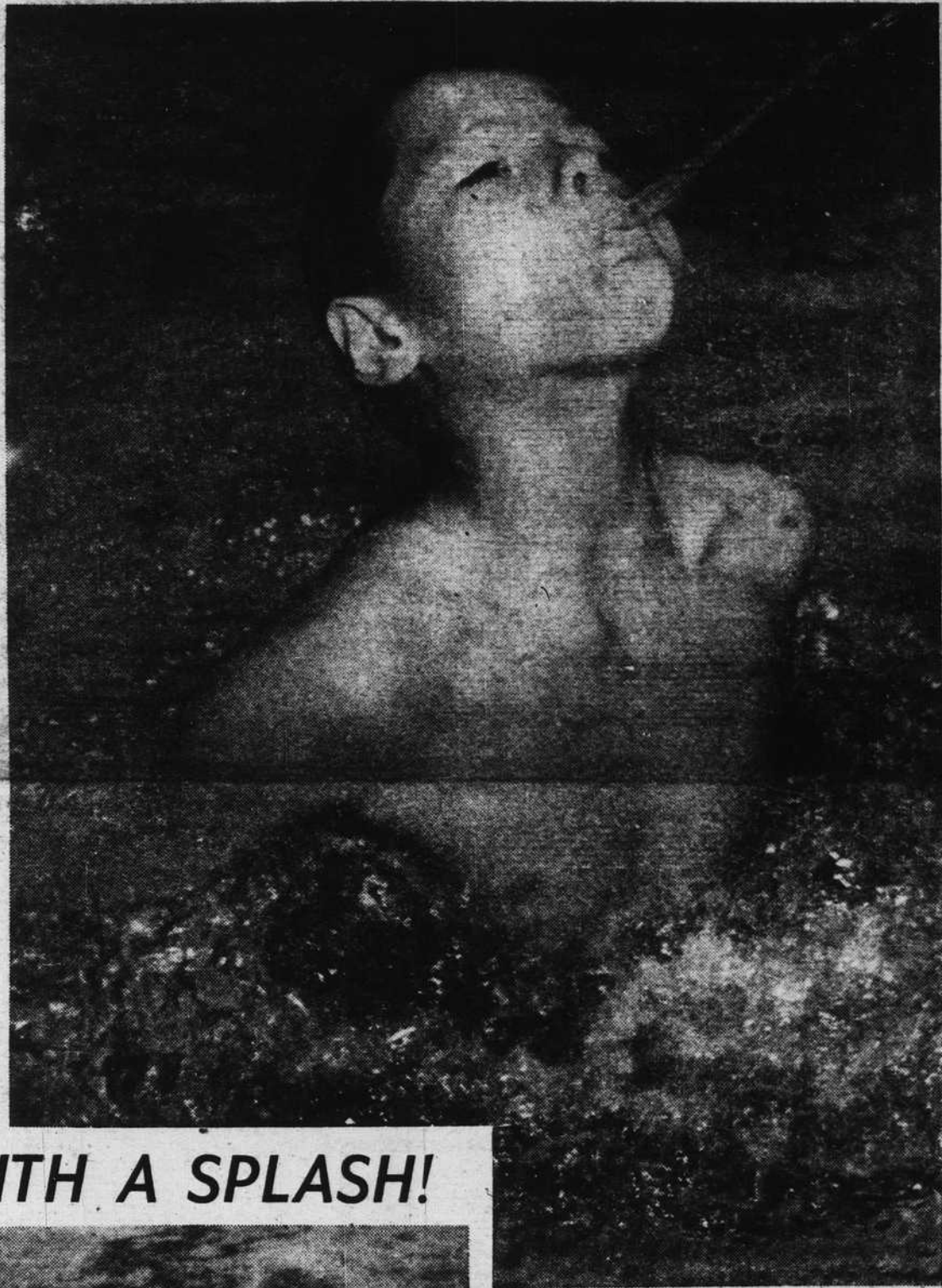
SUMMER VACATION OPENS...

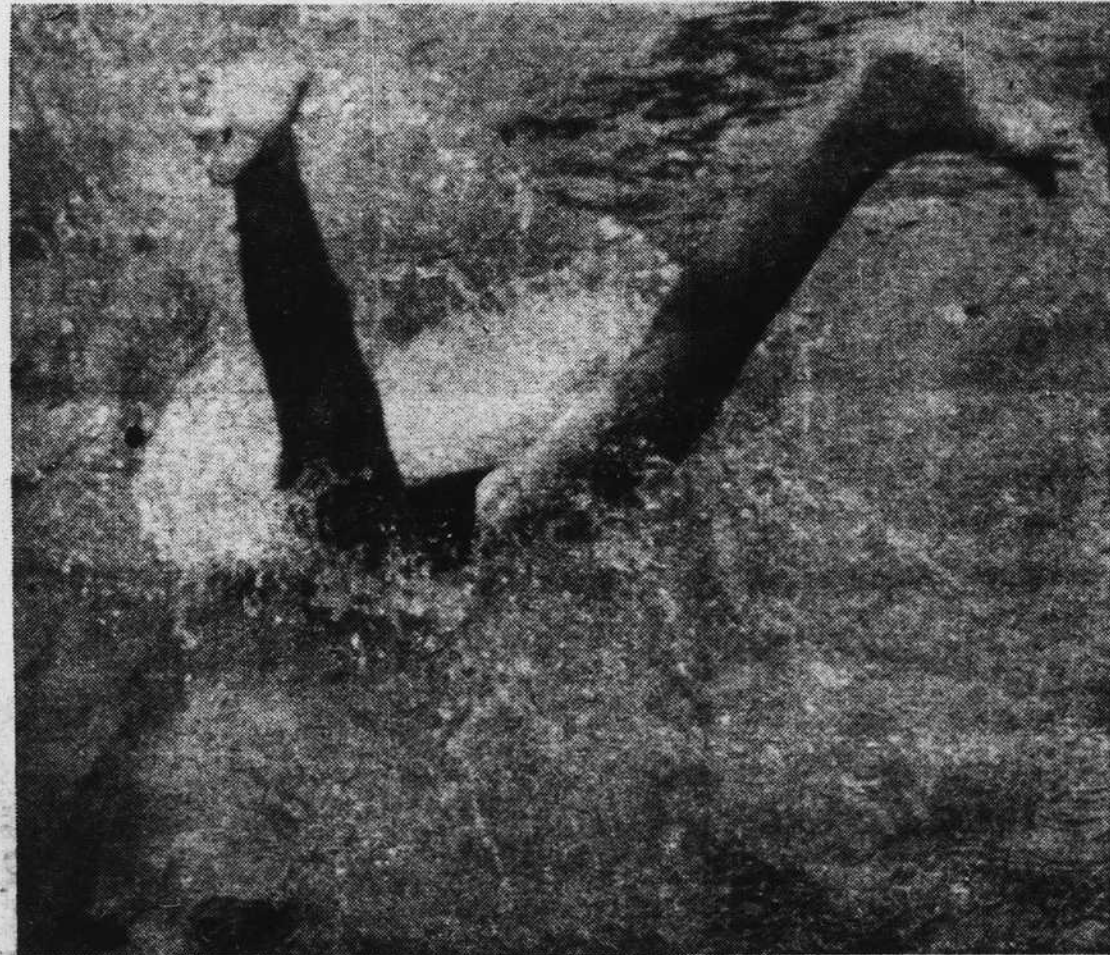
