He leaves next week for this assignment, which is sponsored by the National Science Foundation. His research will be in "The Role of Oxygen in Biological Waste Treatment."

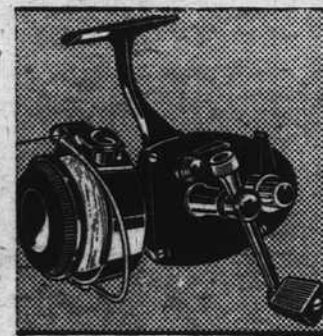
While abroad, Dr. Okun, who heads the UNC Department of Sanitary Engineering will visit public health facilities in England and in the Scandinavian countries.
