An enrollment increase of about five per cent has been forecast for the Chapel Hill public schools this fall.

Superintendent Joseph M. Johnston" said an attendance of 3,630 is forecast when the fall term begins on Sept. 6. This would be 181 above the 3,449 who enrolled last fall.
