

Heavy fines and suspended terms given five for Legion robbery

Five Orange County and Durham youths have been given fines and suspended sentences for burglarizing and wrecking destruction at the Chapel Hill American Legion Clubhouse.

Orange County Recorder's Court Judge L. J. Phipps allowed prosecution to be dropped on felonious breaking and entering charges brought against the five in connection with the July 7 night-time robbery.

All pleaded nolo contendere to misdemeanor charges of larceny and were given fines from \$25 to \$50 apiece and suspended roads sentences of six to 18 months. In addition the court imposed a total of \$900 in charges on the defendants for damages to the building and furnishings.

Arrested last week

Sheriff's deputies and other Durham and Orange County officers arrested them last week. However none of the \$150 in missing money and merchandise was recovered, except for a small radio.

Donald Broadwell, 19, who lives near the clubhouse in Orange County two miles east of Chapel Hill, was given the heaviest penalties of \$50 and costs plus \$200 damage charges for damage to property and an

additional \$25 and costs for larceny. In addition he drew an 18 months roads term suspended two years and another six months suspended term.
