Heavy fines and suspended terms given five for Legion robbery

Five Orange County and Durham youths have been given fines and suspended sentences for burglarizing and wreaking destruction at the Chapel Hill American Legion Clubhouse.

Orange County Recorer's Court Judge L. J. Phipps allowed prosecution to be dropped on felonious breaking and entering charges brought against the five in connection with the July 7 night-time robbery.

All pleaded noto contendere to misdemeanor charges of larceny and were given fines from \$25 to \$50 apiece and suspended roads sentences of six to 18 months. In addition the court imposed a total of \$900 in charges on the defendants for damages to the building and furnishings.


