### As UNC enters 168th year...

MRS. COY W. LONG OF HILLSBORO, Route Two, has been announced as a first place winner in the cherry preserves competition at the N. C. State Fair at Raleigh this week. She also captured one second-place ribbon.

THE SHRUNKEN HEAD USED by "Bloody Mary" in the Playmakers forthcoming production of "South Pacific" is really miscast in the show, according to UNC anthropologist Joffre Coe. Scriptwriters Hammerstein and Joshua Logan, in calling for a shrunken head as part of Bloody Mary's trappings, overlooked the extreme unlikeliness of his species being found in Bali Ha'i. Coe notes that the head-shrinking business has long been confined to the Upper Amazon regions of South America and the Jivaro Indians.

### Election Questions...

Here are the answers to questions most frequently asked of Orange County elections officials during the last few days?

#### AM I ELIGIBLE TO VOTE IN THE NOV. 8 GENERAL ELECTION?

—The easiest answer is, "You are eligible to vote in the general election if you were eligible to vote in either the Republican or Democratic primaries last spring and have not since moved to a new precinct.

#### WHEN MAY NEW VOTERS REGISTER, AND VOTERS CHANGE PRECINCTS?

On the next three Saturdays, Oct. 15 (this Saturday), Oct. 22, and Oct. 29, in each of the 21 precinct polling places, with the precinct registrars, from 9 a.m. to sunset.

#### WHAT IF I CAN'T MAKE IT AT THAT TIME?

You may also register at the home or place of business of the precinct registrar during the weeks between Oct. 15 and 29, 9 a.m. to sunset.

#### WHAT ARE THE ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS?

—Native or naturalized citizen, age 21 by Nov. 8, must be literate, and one-year residency in the state and 30 days in the precinct by Nov. 8.

#### HOW CAN I GET AN ABSENTEE BALLOT?

—By obtaining an application from Elections Board Secretary Clyde Carter in Chapel Hill or Board Chairman Sam Latta in Hillsboro.
