UNC FOOTBALL COACH JIM Hickey and Basketball Coach **Frank McGuire** were the principal speakers at the annual dinner rally for the Chapel Hill unit of the Tar Heel athletic squads' Educational Foundation on Monday night. After their talks on prospects for the coming season there were a number of questions—particularly of McGuire. He gave hard-hitting answers, repeating his strong criticism of ACC Commissioner **Jim Weaver** and of Duke Athletic Director **Eddie Cameron**.

Current plans are to divide the property, designated "Lincoln Park," into 39 lots.
