ORANGE THIS WEEK BECAME the first county in the state to put the surplus food distribution program into operation. The monthly food packages were given to 21 recipients, some of whom were waiting while the big boxes of commodities were being unloaded in Hillsboro Tuesday. One unemployed man with 10 children pitched in to help unload for a couple of hours before lining up at the counter for his own package.

THE MINIMUM FAMILY UNIT of surplus food for a month includes the following 10 items: 5 lb. corn meal, 10 lb. flour, 2 lb. rice, 4½ lb. powdered milk, 4 lb. lard, 2 lb. of beans, 3 lb. rolled oats, one 2½ (lb.) can of dried eggs, and one 3¼ (lb.) can of peanut butter (for 3 mo.).

SUGGESTION WAS MADE BY Chapel Hill Alderman Hubert Robinson (who's seeking reelection) at Monday night's board meeting that the town grant free parking on election day at meters by the Town Hall.
