65 producers of grain receive over \$8,000 in advance payments

The Orange County ASC Office has accepted 311 feed grain acreage reports from farmers in Orange County which makes them eligible to file an agreement to divert corn and/or grain sorghum from production during the 1961 programyear. Of tis number, 65 producers have signed agreements to divert 597.9 acres of corn and 81.3 acres of grain sorghum from production in 1961.

This payment represents a fraction less than 50 per cent of the total payment due on these farms.
