

## GOP county, precinct meetings announced

County Republican Chairman Col. Holland L. Robb this week announced plans for the biennial precinct and county conventions of the Republican party.

In a formal advertisement inserted in this week's issue of The News, the GOP chairman announced that in keeping with the state plan of organization for the party, precinct meetings would be held on the night of Jan. 22. These will be held at the home of the precinct chairmen or at such other places as designated in the advertisement.

At this time the precinct officers and delegates will be chosen to the county convention, set for 2:30 p. m. on Saturday, Feb. 3, in the County Courthouse. While only duly elected delegates may vote at this convention, all Republicans were invited to attend.

Col. Robb said there are currently about 500 persons registered as Republicans in Orange County. During the last three years there has been a new spurt in GOP activities in the county, accompanied by a change in leadership.

The county chairman said he hoped a slate of good Republican candidates would be put up for

county offices to oppose those nominated by Democrats in their party primary next spring.

County Republican officers at this time, in addition to Col. Robb, are Mrs. Mary Grice of Carrboro, Vice-Chairman; Mrs. Kay Whyburn of Chapel Hill, Secretary; and Jim Botsford of Hillsboro, Treasurer. At the County convention new officers will be elected and delegates to the state convention chosen.

## Hillsboro beats orphanage

## New 10-bed clinical research unit opened in Memorial Hospital for Medical School

A new Clinical Research Unit was activated at the University School of Medicine Monday and the first of a number of scheduled patients arrived Tuesday.

The new unit was made possible by a grant, in late 1960, from the National Institute of Health of the U. S. Public Health Service. The initial grant, which covers a seven-year period and involves a total budget of almost \$900,000 for the first three years, makes it possible to carry out meticulous research studies which providing high quality

care to patients with a wide variety of disorders.

The UNC School of Medicine was one of the first schools in the nation to receive a grant for this type of research facility. The UNC Clinical Research Unit is a 10-bed facility located on the fifth floor of the South Wing of North Carolina Memorial Hospital, an arrangement made possible when the Department of Psychiatry voluntarily agreed to relinquish the space for this purpose until a more permanent location for the Unit is available.

The Unit is directed by Dr. Walter Hollander Jr., associate professor of Medicine, and Dr. Robert Zeppa, assistant professor of surgery. Under them is a special staff which includes nursing, dietary and laboratory personnel, but as the Unit is an integral part of N. C. Memorial Hospital, all personnel are also members of the regular hospital staff.
