Director Anthony F. Jenzano describes "You on the Moon" as the most ambitious production yet undertaken by Morehead Planetarium writers, technicians, researchers, producers and narrators.

This new fantasy of what is yet to be projects planetarium excursionists not only by rocket ship to the moon but also 365, 246 days into the future for an accurate and exciting experience of both a space trip and vacation on the most romantic of all satellites.

They will romance, ski on dusty mountain slopes, travel on dust scooters, and go crater

crawling.

They will lose weight without dieting, acquire a cosmic chick tan of radiation space burn, visit the hydroponic gardens and eavesdrop on moon-to-earth personal conversations by radio-

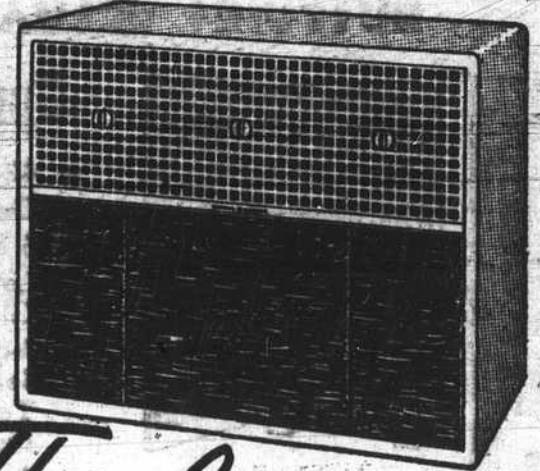
