

Exchange pool opens June 15

Chapel Hill's new Exchange Swimming Pool, almost completed, will open June 15, "if all goes well," it has been announced by Herb Holland.

"The decking around the pool is still to be poured and a few other minor things remain to be done," said Holland. "Should take about 5-7 working days on the pool. The bath-house is well on its way and is expected to be

completed in 15 working days."

The new pool is located off to the left of the Airport Road, just past the Ranch House, on a two-acre tract of land.

"We still have between 55-70 lifetime family memberships open," said Holland. "These memberships are transferable and can be re-sold, subject to the board's approval."

Retiring professors honored at banquet

A banquet in honor of two retiring professors of public health nursing of the University of North Carolina School of Public Health was given here over the weekend.

The two veteran educators in the field of public health nursing are Miss Ruth Hay and Miss Margaret Blee. Both have been on the UNC faculty since the Department of Public Health Nursing was established in 1941

and both will retire on July 1. Miss Hay served as chairman of the department until 1959.

The banquet was attended by members of the faculty of the School of Public Health, University of North Carolina officials and both former and present students who were taught by the two professors.

A recent article in a professional journal said of the two women, "Throughout the two decades of their service to North Carolina in public health nursing, Miss Hay and Miss Blee have built one of the region's outstanding collegiate programs in public health nursing and have extended their contribution beyond the college campus through participation in professional organizations, extension courses and leadership and teaching in other collegiate nursing programs."

Before coming to UNC Miss Hay served on the faculties of the University of California, Western Reserve University and Vanderbilt University. Miss Blee was on the faculty of the University of California before joining the UNC faculty.

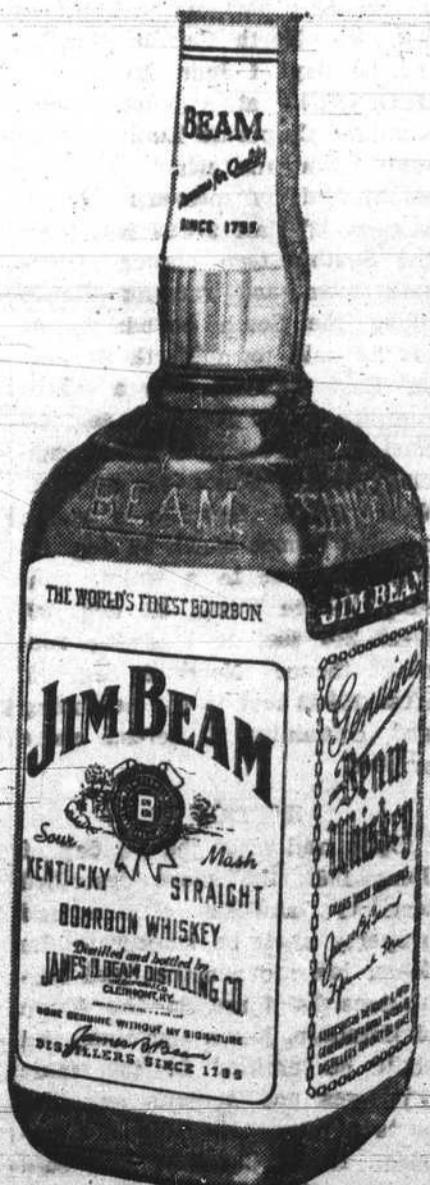

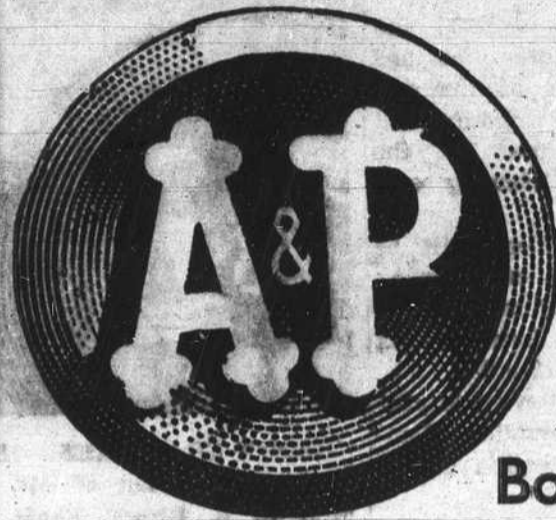
