OF 13 PIECES OF PROPERTY recently advertised for sale by the Sheriff under executions filed by the Tax Department in In Rem proceedings, only one had to be bought by the county. All delinquent taxes were paid by owners or heirs in the other 12 cases. The Addie McDoo estate property, two lots in Cheeks township on which \$48.27 is owed in taxes, was bid in at this figure by the County when the auction was held on May 9. An increased bid of \$25 was filed by Paul Williams of Hillsboro and a re-sale has now been ordered for June 30 at noon at the courthouse door. Bidding on the re-sale will start at \$73.27.

IN THE MAIL FOR THE Chapel Hill Police Department on Monday morning was an envelope with a London, England, postmark, and containing a two-weeks-old Chapel Hill parking ticket accompanied by payment of a dollar bill. Town officials, incidentally, anticipate a \$6,000 drop in parking ticket revenue for the next fiscal year — from \$36,000 back to \$30,000. Said Town Manager Bob Peck: "... Motorists are becoming more cautious in their parking habits ..."
