## GOP greeters ...

CHAPEL HILL HAS A SUPER-sonic jet interceptor of its very own — in a manner of speaking. The University town was one of 28 North Carolina municipalities whose names were emblazoned permanently on the planes of the public relations-conscious 482nd Air Defense Squadron at Seymour Johnson Air Force Base last Saturday. The local mayors were on hand for the "christening."
