At the request of city officials a survey is being made by the state of its holdings there to determine a value on its automatically tax-exempt property. Raleigh has for some time been discussing the matter of some payment in lieu of taxes by the state, since it provides traditional municipal services free of charge, just as Chapel Hill does for the University. —It was even casually suggested, though not seriously, that Raleigh de-annex the state buildings in the uptown district. Then they'd at least qualify for out-of-town double water rates!

**CHAPEL HILL POLICE HAVE** had a previous acquaintance with phosphorous, prior to the mysterious blaze discovered near the campus last Saturday night.
