

Board asks area highway official to meet on thoroughfare plan

The Chapel Hill aldermen have asked Division Highway Commissioner James G. W. MacLamroc of Greensboro to meet with them Dec. 10 in an attempt to finally nail down the local thoroughfare plan.

The aldermen on Monday received from the Carrboro Town Board their revised version of the plan, approved it and forwarded it to the State Highway Commission in Raleigh.

The Carrboro Board made only minor changes in the 32-project long-range plan. One involved the addition of a road link between Pleasant Drive and North Greensboro St. Two others set up Carrboro area projects on a higher priority.

Endorsed fully

The Chapel Hill Board endorsed the total plan as returned to it by Carrboro. But Board members expressed concern that some highway improvements projects in the local area were being planned and even carried out through Commissioner MacLamroc's office without being coordinated in the thoroughfare plan.

For this reason they asked that the meeting be set up with him on Dec. 10. The Carrboro Board and the District Planning Board will also be invited to this meeting.

Among other matters of business, the aldermen:

Agreed to pay a portion of the cost of extending a sewer line westward on Roosevelt Ave. to a point where Ray Jolly could tap onto it.

By a 4-2 split vote revised the budget ordinance to appropriate \$700 to the Merchants Association for its downtown Christmas lighting; Town Manager Bob Peck and Attorney J. Q. LeGrand questioned the legality and advisability of the appropriation.

Approved the issuance of \$140,000 in bond anticipation notes for purchase of the municipal center site and construction of a new fire station.

Finally approved a formal

resolution whereby the Chapel Hill Housing Authority would pay 10 per cent of the residential rents it receives to the town in lieu of property taxes.

Held over for further consideration pending receipt of full specifications bids on a chassis for a garbage truck; and awarded a low contract for two dump truck chassis to Yates Motor Co., low bidder, for \$4,854, trade-in included.

Heard from Town Manager Bob Peck that the recent reduction by the State of the tax as-

essment on the Glen Lennox properties in Chapel Hill would cost the town about \$5,000 annually at the present tax rate; that the town would have to refund about \$2,500 to owner William Muirhead for taxes paid last year; and that this would leave Glen Lennox with a tax bill of about \$25,000 a year on the existing rate.

Agreed to install a sewer line costing approximately \$5,000 to serve the McMaster St. area, when funds become available, if the property owners of the area present a petition pledging the cost of installation of tie-in lines.
