Town Hall indebtedness paid off before due

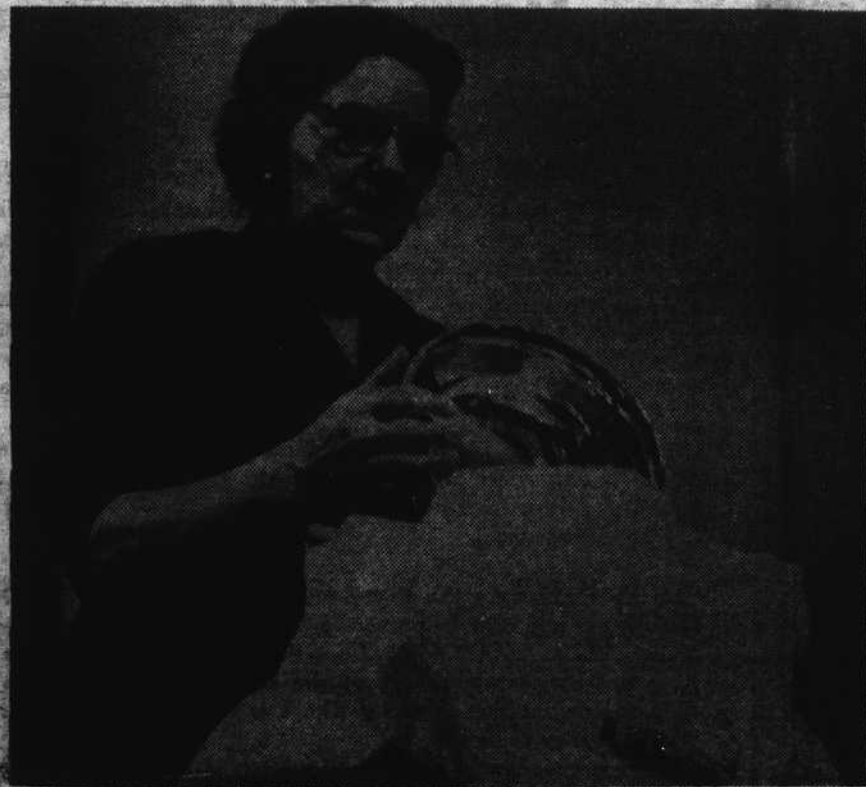

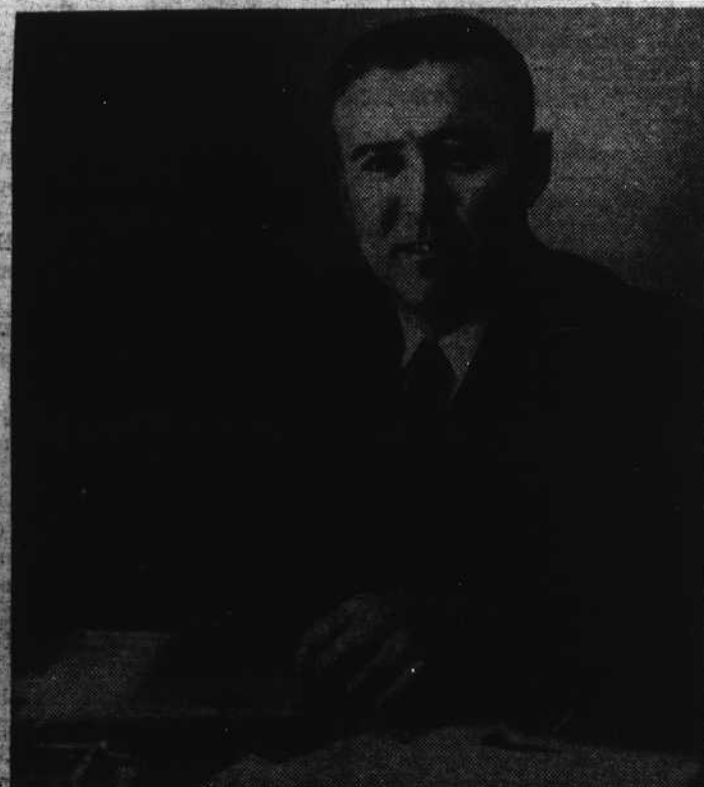
