AFTER COMPILING SUCH A distinguished record during 20-odd years in Congress, there are few who'd dispute ex-Congressman Carl Durham's ability to get right to the source of information which might be needed to solve any problem. That's what he did on June 6 when he considered it necessary for anniversary purposes to know the date of his wedding three years ago and didn't dare ask his wife. He called the church and asked for a check of the records.

REP. L. J. PHIPPS IN HIS brochure in behalf of his current candidacy for State Commander of the American Legion says he will resign his seat in the General Assembly prior to the convening of the State Legion Convention in Charlotte this summer. It will be up to Orange County Democrats to nominate a successor for appointment by the Governor.

MAYOR FRED CLAYTOR and former Highway Chairman Sandy Graham composed the third known delegation which has talked to the Governor in the past week and a half in connection with the recent postponement of the bid letting for the proposed new access road into Hillsboro. They reported "a very satisfactory interview with the Governor" on Tuesday and noted "he's looking into the matter."

IN OTHER ROAD MATTER, Highway Commissioner MacLamroc called The News this week to advise the proposed eastern bypass around Hillsboro, which he is sponsoring at the instigation of opponents of the access project, is contemplated only to Highway 70 and not around to 86 North as at one time was reported.

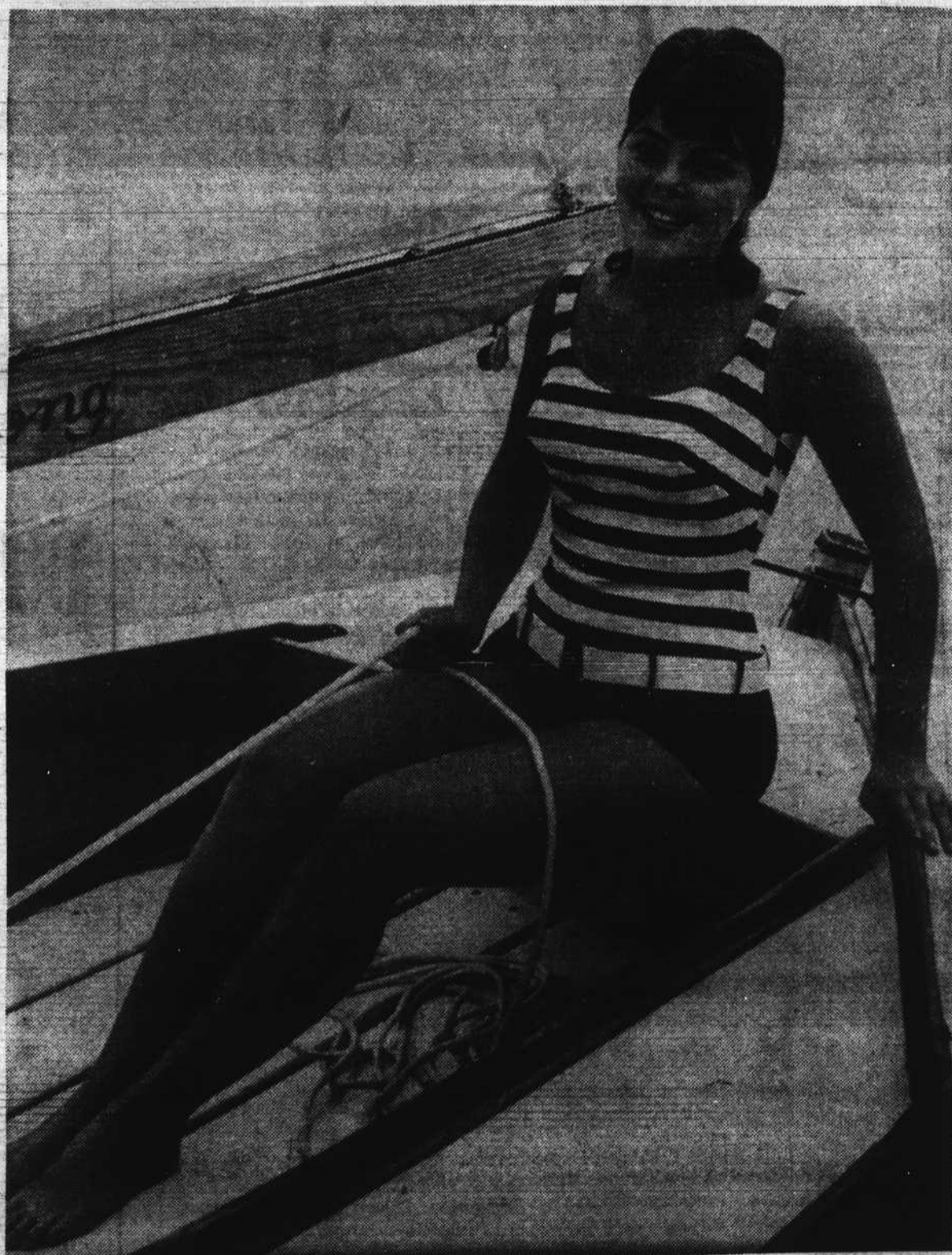
