

# County board, highway folks in tiff over road

The myth of joint authority in secondary road allocations between the Highway Department and the Boards of County Commissioners may be on the verge of explosion in Orange County.

In the balance is a proposed \$36,000 allocation for a road the County Commissioners say they don't want. The amount involved for the single road is half the total the Highway Dept. proposes to allot to stabilization projects in this county in 1963-64.

Forewarned of the county

board's adamant position, division highway personnel Monday failed to appear for a scheduled meeting at 2 p. m. with the commissioners and neglected to advise county people the meeting had been cancelled or the reasons therefor.

The meeting had been scheduled to allow the Division Commissioner James G. W. MacLamroc and/or his staff to present the "proposed" list of allocations of Secondary Road projects the Highway Dept. had decided to include in the next fiscal year's construction program, an annual ritual in which the Engineer reads off the proposed program and hands the commissioners a pen to attach their O-kay. Up until now there's no record of the county board failing in the role of rubber stamp, although often a majority has failed to appreciate the complete package that has been offered.

Bone of contention now appears to be this: next year's program, according to advance notice given Chairman Donald Stanford, allots \$36,000 of the \$72,856 in stabilization funds for a new road extending SR 1101 from its intersection with SR 100 (Orange Grove Road) to N. C. Highway 54 at a point close to Bethlehem Church. Chairman Stanford is embarrassed by this large allocation through family property for a road of low priority in comparison with other pressing needs in the county, and other commissioners share the same view and see other needs far more pressing.

They propose to withhold approval if and when the Highway officials get around to scheduling another meeting or telling them why the other was cancelled without the courtesy of a notification.

Commissioner MacLamroc told The News two hours before the meeting it had been cancelled, but the commissioners learned it 15 minutes after they had assembled at convening time and then the result of long distance telephone inquiries.
