

Deadline for Warren Clinic pledges 15th

Sponsors of the R. F. Warren Memorial Clinic at Prospect Hill have approved a pledge campaign, with deadline of June 15, in an effort to secure sufficient funds to begin construction of the building.

In accordance with the by-laws of the R. F. Warren Memorial Clinic Corporation which call for the annual election of officers the following were elected: Lacy Satterfield Jr., President, Jimmy Winslow, Vice President, Geneva Warren, Secretary - Treasurer.

Bids in from the various contractors were discussed at length. It was found that Robert Oakes, Chapel Hill contractor with a bid of \$28,614.34 was low. Further study of the bid

by the building committee and conference with the contractor is planned.

Plans and specifications for the building, the result of a considerable amount of work on the part of the building committee, were displayed at the meeting.

The treasurer reported money on hand slightly in excess of \$10,000 and noted that since the time the money was received by the corporation, it has earned approximately \$1,000 in interest.

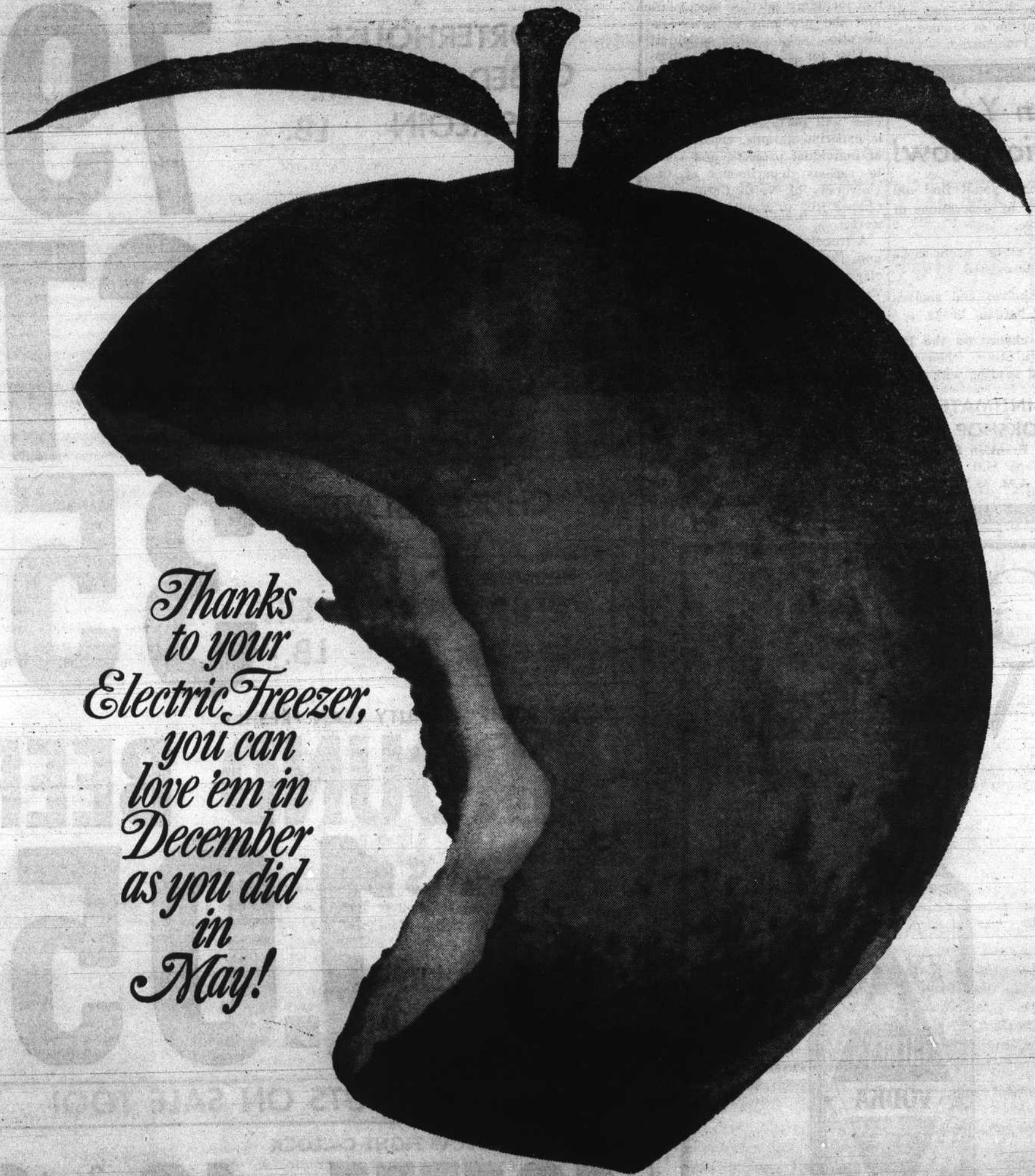
A pledge plan presented by the president was made into motion by Jimmy Winslow and seconded by Gilbert Pittard to form a committee to seek pledges of \$100 per family to be paid

over a four year period after actual construction has begun. Since general sentiment, according to those present, is that efforts to raise further cash would be futile until construction actually gets under way, the pledges in a sufficient amount to justify borrowing the remainder of money needed to complete building was judged to be the best procedure. The motion received unanimous approval, and June 15 was named as deadline for getting pledges in. If the pledge campaign is successful the building committee is ready to proceed with borrowing needed money and starting construction. Bulldozing for clearance of the building site will be started immediately.
