Moving in a new direction, the Mayor's Committee requested a joint meeting with the Chael Hill Board of Education. The Committee indicated that it wanted to know what plans the School Board has for desegregating Northside and Frank Graham Elementary Porter Schools, and Lincoln Junior-Senior High. All other schools in the stem are desegrated to some extent, but Northside, Frank Porter Graham and Lincoln have 100 per cent Negro student bodies.

The Committee also will inquire about the University School of Education's policy on sending practice teachers to Negro schools in Chapel Hill. The Committee was told no practice. teachers are being assigned to Negro schools here now. One member of the Committee pointed out that many practice teachers have to go to Durham and other communities at great inconvenience and additional expense.
