

Museum to open daily

Beginning next Monday June 17th, the Orange County Historical Museum will be open each day in the week—Mon. through Friday from 10-12 A. M. and 2 to 4 P. M. as well as on Sat. and Sun. afternoons from 2 to 5 P. M.

This will be on an experimental basis for a few weeks to determine if there is a need for such services. The Museum will

also serve as an Information Center for tourists during this period. Historic Hillsborough pamphlets may be obtained with tours outlined and explained here.

During this time the Information Center for Historic Hillsborough will be maintained under the joint auspices of the Garden Club and the Historical Society.

were reported to have shown little or no inclination to change their segregation policies:

Colonial Drug Store, Leo's Grill, Clarence's The Shack, Brady's, The Pines, The Patio, and Tar Heel Sandwich.

The Committee members agreed that they had exhausted all possible efforts to encourage the businesses to desegregate before recommending the public accommodations ordinance.

Letters to motels

The Committee also decided to send letters to Chapel Hill's motels asking them to desegregate and offering the Committee's services. Only three motels would be involved — Watts, Tar Heel Motor Lodge, and the University Motel.

Moving in a new direction, the Mayor's Committee requested a joint meeting with the Chapel Hill Board of Education. The Committee indicated that it wanted to know what plans the School Board has for desegregating Northside and Frank Porter Graham Elementary Schools, and Lincoln Junior-Senior High. All other schools in the system are desegregated to some extent, but Northside, Frank Porter Graham and Lincoln have 100 per cent Negro student bodies.

The Committee also will inquire about the University School of Education's policy on sending practice teachers to Negro schools in Chapel Hill. The Committee was told no practice teachers are being assigned to Negro schools here now. One member of the Committee pointed out that many practice teachers have to go to Durham and other communities at great inconvenience and additional expense.
